Summer Reading: Adventure Begins at Your Library June 03 - July 13

The Thorntown Public Library will begin its summer reading program for children on Monday, June 3rd. This year's theme is "Adventure Begins at Your Library." Kids can stop in the library to register and pick up a summer reading log. Parents/Caregivers are also eligible to win some great prizes just for encouraging their children to participate! Kids in the program are asked to keep track of the minutes they read and can earn incentive prizes for reading each week. A FREE book and the chance to enter our Money Machine will also be given to each child that reaches their summer goal. This program runs until July 13th.



We are also excited to bring other fun entertainment experiences to the community during this time. Our kickoff program arrives on June 4th at 2:00 with the Water Show (sponsored by Benjamin Franklin Plumbing). This is a fun and wacky show and everyone will get wet! Other fun programs this

summer will include Silly Safaris animal show, Roz Puppets, Chemistry Is a Blast, a Bluey Party, and a Foam Party (sponsored by the Knights of Pythias.)

We are also bringing back our Color Run, the Carnival, and a few more fun surprises! Registration is required for the Foam Party so make sure you sign up as soon as possible! Teen Summer Reading

Sign up begins June 3rd. Receive a bag with goodies upon sign-up! Track the hours you read on your log. Receive a raffle ticket for each hour read (up to 12 hours). Those who complete their reading challenge (reading 6 hours) earn a FREE book and a turn in the Money Machine where you could win real money!

Teens may complete any of three take home crafts to earn extra raffle tickets. There will also be three library programs: The Escape Experience, Big Games at the Park (including the National Guard inflatable obstacle course) and a Teen Taste Test Challenge. 

June Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On June 10 at 1:30 the book club will meet in room 116 to discuss *There Once Were Wolves* by Charlotte McConaghy.

Inti Flynn arrives in Scotland with her twin sister, Aggie, to lead a team of biologists tasked



with reintroducing fourteen gray wolves into the remote Highlands. She hopes to heal not only the dying landscape, but Aggie, too, unmade by the terrible secrets that drove the sisters out of Alaska.

Inti is not the woman she once was, either, changed by the harm she's witnessed—inflicted by humans on both the wild and each other. Yet as the wolves surprise everyone by thriving, Inti begins to let her guard down, even opening herself up to the possibility of love. But when a farmer is found dead, Inti knows where the town will lay blame. Unable to accept her wolves could be responsible, Inti makes a reckless decision to protect them. But if the wolves didn't make the kill, then who did? And what will Inti do when the man she is falling for seems to be the prime suspect?

Propulsive and spell-binding, Charlotte McConaghy's Once There Were Wolves is the unforgettable story of a woman desperate to save the creatures she loves—if she isn't consumed by a wild that was once her refuge.

The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets in the Thorntown Public Library meeting room from 2-4:00 p.m. on the first and third Wednesdays. All sessions encourage working on individual projects or on the group project. The group activity on May 1 and 15 was making place mats using old greeting cards, then adding a gourd illustration. There has been a request to repeat the place mat project in June, so supplies will be on hand for that purpose. However, on June 5 and 19 melted crayon art on gourds will be the feature and supplies, tools, and gourds will be available. Zentangle is planned for July 3 and 17.
