Thorntown Heritage Museum Hosts Barn Fundraiser

The Thorntown Heritage Museum is working with Elements 5 Arts and Wellness to host a fundraiser to raise money for its barn restoration project. "Quilt Square Painting: a Thorntown Heritage Museum Fundraiser" is on October 4 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. in the library meeting rooms. Participants will paint a pre-stenciled guilt square in their own colors under the guidance of a teacher. You have your choice of a 12x12 inch canvas for \$30 or a 12-inch pressed wood square for \$40. Register at the library or on the library's website by October 3rd. Pay ahead of time by coming into the library or scanning the QR code. Cash, card, and check are



October Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On October 14 at 1:30 the book club will meet in room 116 to discuss *The Anthropocene Reviewed* by John Green.



The Anthropocene is the current geologic age, in which humans have profoundly reshaped the planet and its biodiversity. In this remarkable symphony of essays adapted and expanded from his groundbreaking podcast, bestselling author John Green reviews different facets of the human-centered planet on a five-star scale—from the QWERTY keyboard and sunsets to Canada geese and *Penguins of Madagascar*.

Funny, complex, and rich with detail, the reviews chart the contradictions of contemporary humanity. As a species, we are both far too powerful and not nearly powerful enough, a paradox that came into sharp focus as we faced a global pandemic that both separated us and bound us together.

John Green's gift for storytelling shines throughout this masterful collection. The Anthropocene Reviewed is a open-hearted exploration of the paths we forge and an unironic celebration of falling in love with the world.

Genealogy 101: Your Roadmap to Success

Medicare 101 - Saturday, Oct. 26 1:30-2:30

Significant and unprecedented changes are coming to Medicare in 2025! Do you know what they are? Come to a **FREE** educational presentation at the Library to find out, and get the answers you need to your other Medicare questions, as well!

This program is for anyone already on Medicare, anyone approaching Medicare age (turning 65), any spouses and/or children of those on Medicare who help make these types of decisions, and anyone under 65 who is on disability and receiving Medicare benefits as well.

Information covered will include:

- How can some qualify to have a lower Part B premium, or "Extra Help" paying for their prescriptions and/or Part D premiums?
- How and when can or should I enroll in Medicare?
- What are "Special Enrollment Periods" and why do some qualify to have these all year long?
- What does Medicare cover, what doesn't it cover, and what might be your potential out-of-pocket exposure?
- What to consider when choosing Supplements, Medicare Advantage plans and Part D Prescription Coverage, as well as cost saving strategies for the years ahead.

The Medicare Annual Enrollment Period is October 15th - December 7th, each year. This program will be repeated on **Thursday**, **Nov. 7 at 2:30 p.m.**

Gourd Plans

The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets in the Thorntown Public Library meeting room from 2-4:00 p.m. on the first and third Wednesdays. All sessions encourage working on individual projects or on the group project. October 2 and 16 will be a review of the uses of luffa gourds and making a pin or ornament from a slice of luffa. On November 6 and 20 gourd catcher toys will be crafted. On December 4 and 18 participants will apply Pastel Ground, a textured acrylic primer, on egg or larger gourds before experimenting with color pastels and pencils to decorate them.

The Indiana Gourd Society's state show will be held in the library meeting rooms on Saturday, October 19 from 10-4:00. There is no charge for admission, so now is the time to add it to calendars to see a wide range of exhibits.
