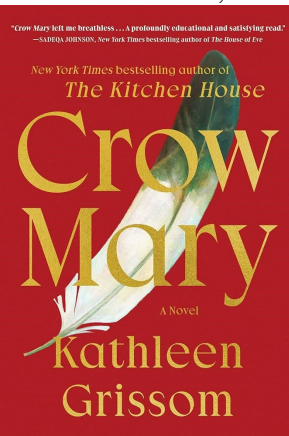


September Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On September 9 at 1:30 the book club will meet in room 116 to discuss *Crow Mary* by Kathleen Grissom.

In 1872, sixteen-year-old Goes First, a Crow Native woman, marries Abe Farwell, a white fur trader. He gives her the name Mary, and they set off on the long trip to his trading post in Saskatchewan, Canada. Along the way, she finds a fast friend in a Métis named Jeannie,

makes a lifelong enemy in a wolfer named Stiller, and, despite learning a dark secret of Farwell's past, falls in love with her husband.



The winter trading season passes peacefully. Then, on the eve of their return to Montana, a group of drunken whiskey traders slaughters forty Nakota—despite Farwell's efforts to stop them. Mary, hiding from the hail of bullets, sees the murderers, including Stiller, take five Nakota women back to their fort. She begs Farwell to save them, and when he refuses, Mary takes two guns, creeps into the fort, and saves the women from certain death. Thus, she sets off a whirlwind of colliding cultures that brings out the worst and best in the cast of unforgettable characters and pushes the love between Farwell and Crow Mary to the breaking point.

The Thorntown Heritage Museum is working with Elements 5 Arts and Wellness to host a fundraiser to raise money for its barn restoration project. "Quilt Square Painting: a Thorntown Heritage Museum Fundraiser" is on October 4 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. in the library meeting rooms. Participants will paint a pre-stenciled quilt square in their own colors under the guidance of a teacher. You have your choice of a 12x12 inch canvas for \$30 or a 12-inch pressed wood square for \$40. Register at the library or on the library's website by September 20th. Thorntown Heritage Museum - Festival Schedule

The Thorntown Heritage Museum has a lot to offer visitors during the Festival of the Turning Leaves (September 27-29). The museum will be open 11-4 p.m. Friday and Saturday and 12-4 p.m. on Sunday for tours. Saturday and Sunday, the museum will have vendors on the property including WiseWood Farms selling honey and acclaimed mystery author Lori Rader-Day selling her books. Saturday following the parade, the museum is hosting a touch-a-tractor event and Dave's Blue Barrel Train will give rides. Families can come see various tractors as well as get a look at some farm equipment and tools that pre-date those tractors. The event is free, and so are tours all weekend long. The museum closes for the season September 29 at 4 p.m. Tours are still available by appointment. Call the library and ask for Kirsten to schedule. Sugar Creek Historical Society will meet September 19 at 7 p.m. at the museum. The public is welcome.

Dementia Friends Session - Sept. 24

There will be a Dementia Friends session on Tuesday, September 24th at 6:00 p.m. in the library meeting rooms. Dementia Friends sessions are a brief, but impactful way to learn about dementia. You will learn ways to understand and appreciate the perspective of someone living with dementia. Memories Woven Together - 4 sessions: September 3rd, 5th, 10th, & 12th 1-3:00 p.m.

Weaving has been an art form for centuries and it has many forms and materials used to create it. This project involves the creation of an artwork that contains our memories. You may bring in cloth, buttons, old jewelry, medals and anything else that you would like to incorporate into the piece. We will have fun learning the weaving process. Resident fiber artist Gene Bayless will share his knowledge and love for weaving with you as Terri Gavin instructs you in the basic skills. Everyone will work at their own pace; the point is to relax and enjoy the process as you learn. You will leave with a project that has special memories attached that can be shared with loved ones.

Mosaic Art: Beauty from the Broken - 4 sessions: Sept. 17th, 19th, 24th, & 26th 1-3:00

Mosaics are one of the earliest art forms and can be seen at the ruins of Pompeii as well as many other cultures. Today's mosaics are practical as well as beautiful, and we will be creating steppingstones and coasters during this class. Like weaving, mosaics can include memories. Art Instructor Terri Gavin has used broken dishes, small toy figures, buttons, and even coins to create past projects. You will also have the option to include memories in your design, if so desired. These will be artworks that can be used every day and bring a special touch to your home or garden.
